

YOU ARE MY BELOVED SON; WITH YOU I AM WELL PLEASED

The feast of Jesus' baptism reminds us that by our baptism we are God's children, made in His image, and with whom God is "well pleased".

God delights in us, especially as we strive to do His will. Jesus' baptism commissioned him to do the will of God, bringing reconciliation to a suffering world. Having been baptized into Christ, we can carry on as His hands, feet, and voice in the world to do what's needed to care for each other and for creation which is now suffering.

"The entire material universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God." (LS#84) "The natural environment is a collective good, the patrimony of all humanity and the responsibility of everyone. If we make something our own, it is only to administer it for the good of all." (LS#95)

As we mentioned last week, we in Laudato Si' will strive this year to bring you more information and ideas to help you understand how you can care for creation and why certain actions can make a real difference. As you consider goals or resolutions for 2022 that support care for creation, think about something that was suggested by Pope Francis: Simplicity.

In a 12/30/19 Twitter post, Pope Francis advised, "In its genuine simplicity, the nativity scene reminds us it is not the quantity of things that counts in life, but the quality of relationships. Drawing our gaze to God, who is poor in possessions and rich in love, it recalls us to what is essential."
